A Guide to Direct Cremation

What is a direct cremation?

Direct cremation, also referred to as a cremation without ceremony or an <u>unattended funeral</u>, is ideal for those who do not want a service or ceremony prior to the cremation.

Your loved one will be collected a few days before the funeral from their place of rest, and cared for in our high quality mortuary facilities before being taken directly to the crematorium on the day of the cremation, in a specialised funeral vehicle.

Unlike a traditional funeral, there is no procession, so no requirement for costly extras such as a hearse or limousines, and no funeral service or ceremony at the crematorium. A direct cremation usually takes place without the attendance of any mourners. The direct nature of this service means that there is no embalming and no opportunity to view the deceased. We will provide a simple coffin, and your loved one will be dressed in a simple gown for cremation.

Following a direct cremation, the ashes will be scattered in our gardens of remembrance or can be returned to the family upon request, at an additional cost. If you are planning a memorial with the ashes present, please allow up to 6 weeks for the return of ashes.

How much does a direct cremation cost?

Direct cremation is one of the most affordable funeral options in the UK. You should expect to pay considerably less than the average traditional funeral you'd arrange with the assistance of a Funeral Director.

The cost will differ between providers, and not all packages will include the same services. Many providers will also only cover a specific locality, with additional fees outside of a specific radius.

A direct cremation by Simplicity Cremation costs £995 and is available throughout all of mainland Great Britain. The cost covers all of the necessary elements of the cremation, which includes:

- Doctor's fees for medical certificates
- Cremation fees

- Collection of the deceased from place of rest a few days prior to cremation*
- A simple wood effect coffin
- Transportation to the crematorium in a specialised funeral vehicle

*We can bring the deceased straight into care for an additional charge of £250 should they be resting outside of a hospital or coroners. This covers care in our quality mortuary facilities until the day of cremation.

Please consider that unlike a traditional funeral where the Funeral Director will invoice you after the funeral has taken place, the payment must be made in full before we can begin to make any arrangements.

Why do people choose direct cremation?

A direct cremation suits those people that for whatever reason, do not want a funeral service at their own or their loved one's funeral. There are a number of reasons an increasing number of people are choosing direct cremation, which may include:

A direct cremation is an affordable alternative to a traditional funeral

There are an increasing number of people looking for more affordable funeral options, although this is not always the driving factor for those that choose direct cremation. When cost is the reason, it's often because the deceased wished for the money that would have been spent on a traditional funeral to spent in a more meaningful way by their family

Your loved one expressed their wishes for a low key funeral

Some people really do not want a fuss when they are gone. Many people do not see the value in some of the ceremonial aspects such as a hearse, limousines or floral tributes and would prefer a simpler affair.

Your loved one did not wish for a funeral with a religious ceremony

Can you attend a direct cremation?

A direct cremation does not usually offer any kind of funeral service or the presence of a minister or officiant, and usually takes place without the presence of any mourners.

If you'd prefer a funeral with the option to attend, you may find our <u>intimate funeral</u> which allows We provide the cremation without any religious aspects. Should your loved one have wanted a religious service, you may wish to organise a memorial at a later date.

Family or friends of the deceased live far away

Distance can often make it hard for the family to travel to a funeral, particularly if they live abroad. It is easier to transport ashes abroad than to repatriate. Some people also choose direct cremation because as the next of kin, the responsibility to arrange the funeral has fallen to them, but they were not particularly close to the deceased.

You want to hold a celebration at a different time and place away from the crematorium Many people opt for this kind of funeral in favour of holding a memorial or celebration of life in honour of their loved one at a later date.
